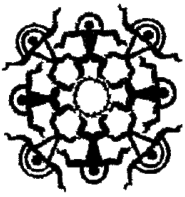

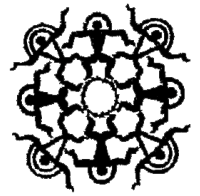

1. **Acceleration:** *To earn credits to advance (grades 9-12 only)*
2. **Enrichment:** *Foster lifelong learning.*
3. **Remedial:** *Complete graduation requirements.*

**REGISTRATION PROCEDURES
AND PAYMENT OF FEES**

1. Complete and sign the required Registration Form. Be sure to obtain parent or guardian’s signature for Student/Parent Commitments & Expectations form.

2. Submit your required Registration Form together with your payment. Payment in full must be made at time of registration.
3. Registration is not completed until full payment is made. **NO** registration will be processed if information is incomplete. Financial aid may be available from the Native Hawaiian Summer School Assistance Program at Alu Like Inc.

Summer School is supported entirely by tuition. Classes may be canceled if enrollment is low. Students will be informed and rescheduled if classes are full or canceled. Registration priority is given to students who require a credit to complete graduation requirements.

WITHDRAWAL AND REFUND POLICIES:

1. If a student is having difficulties in a course and desires to avoid an “F” grade, s/he must withdraw within the first week (5 days) of a semester. Otherwise the grade that the student earned at the time of withdrawal will be the final grade.
2. **Withdrawal Procedures:**
 - a. Your parent or guardian must approve a student’s withdrawal.
 - b. See the Summer School Director to process your withdrawal.
 - c. Return all items checked out to your teacher and obtain clearance signature.
 - d. Return the class clearance form to the Summer School business office.
 - e. Payments will be required for all lost or misplaced books.
 - f. Grade clearance will not be completed without full restitution of amounts owed.
3. Refunds: Please call the Summer School Director at 735-8278 to arrange for a refund. **See dates below.**

***Refund policy: 100% refund by Wednesday, May 26, 2010.
50% refund by Monday May 31, 2010.
No refunds after Tuesday, June 01, 2010.***

GRADING POLICY: Grades are awarded based on class work, homework, other assignments, class participation in discussion and activities, written and/or oral reports, projects, tests, quizzes, and final exams, if applicable. Specific criteria for grading may vary with different teachers and for each course. Letter grades A, B, C, D, F will be equivalent to the grade point value of 4.0, 3.0, 2.0, 1.0, or 0.

INTERIM REPORTS: Parents or guardians will be mailed an Interim Report if a student is failing the course.

REPORT CARDS: Report cards will be given to each student at the end of the summer school session. **If you would like the report card sent home please give a self-addressed stamped envelope to your child’s teacher.** Grades will also be sent to the student’s home school. **Please be aware that there is a \$5.00 charge for duplicate copies.**

Aloha Parent/Guardian & Student

The following information is provided to each parent and your child to help provide a safe learning environment while enrolled in our summer school program.

THE ADMINISTRATION WILL:

- Provide a safe and wholesome environment so that instruction will not be disrupted.
- Notify parents if their child is absent from school.

THE TEACHER WILL:

- Provide instruction appropriate to the course requirements.
- Award a letter grade for credit.

THE PARENT(S)/GUARDIAN(S) WILL:

- Notify the school by calling 735-8278 if your child will be absent from school.
- Write a note to the Summer School Director when your child returns to school.
- Help your child to obey all summer school rules.

THE STUDENT WILL:

- Attend school and make every effort to cooperate with teachers in regard to classroom behavior, course requirements and homework assignments.
- Cooperate with all DOE and school rules with special attention to *1) coming to school on time, 2) attending classes ready to learn with books and supplies, 3) keeping all alcohol, tobacco and drug contraband items off-campus, 4) honoring a zero tolerance for alcohol, tobacco and drugs, and 5) demonstrating mutual respect, good listening, and communication skills.*
- *Agree to all Hawaiian protocol practices.*

THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION CHAPTER 19 Regulations and school guidelines are implemented during the summer school session. Discipline guidelines and consequences are as follows:

- 1) Disciplinary action against any student attending summer school shall be imposed by the Summer School Director.
- 2) Prohibited student conduct, penalties are implemented, and applies to all students in summer school during summer school hours on school premises or during department supervised activities.

Class A Offenses: unlawful conduct: a) assault b) burglary, c) dangerous weapons, substances or instruments, possession or use of; d) drug paraphernalia; possession, use, or sale of; g) illicit substances; possession, use of sale of, h) murder, i) property damage, j) robbery, k) sexual offenses; and l) terrorist threatening.

Class B Offenses: unlawful conduct a) disorderly conduct; b) false alarm, rendering of; c) gambling, d) harassment; e) theft; and f) trespassing.

Class C and D Offenses: unlawful conduct; pertains to disorderly conduct, and smoking tobacco and all other behavior which disrupts the class or is a violation of school rules.

Any student who commits a class A or class B offense shall be dismissed from summer school with no refund. The Summer School Director shall notify and meet with the student and parent(s) or guardian(s) prior to dismissal from summer school. The Summer School Director shall file a Chapter 19 report and shall provide a copy to the student and parent.

A Summer School Director in an emergency may impose a crises suspension of a student immediately after the student's conduct presents a clear threat to the physical safety of self or others or is so extremely disruptive as to make the student's immediate removal necessary to preserve the right of other students to pursue an education that is free from undue disruption. The Summer School Director shall notify and meet with the student and parent prior to the student's reinstatement in summer school.

No student shall be reinstated without a meeting.

A student whose behavior is disruptive to the class room and in violation of school rules shall be reprimanded or counseled. The students shall follow the dress code established for summer school. A student may be dismissed from school if misconduct continues after receiving a reprimand or counseling. Due process shall be followed for every student.

SUMMER SCHOOL ATTENDANCE POLICY

- ONE (1) SUMMER SCHOOL DAY = 5 DAYS OF REGULAR SCHOOL
- THREE (3) UNEXCUSED TARDIES = 1 DAY OF UNEXCUSED ABSENCE
- Forty-five (45) or more minutes missed from class= 1 DAY of ABSENCE
- THREE (3) DAYS OF UNEXCUSED ABSENCES WILL BE GROUNDS FOR DISMISSAL FROM SUMMER SCHOOL with NO REIMBURSEMENT

Paid tuitions will be reimbursed once financial aid from the Native Hawaiian Summer School Assistance Program at Alu Like Inc. or other agencies are confirmed.
